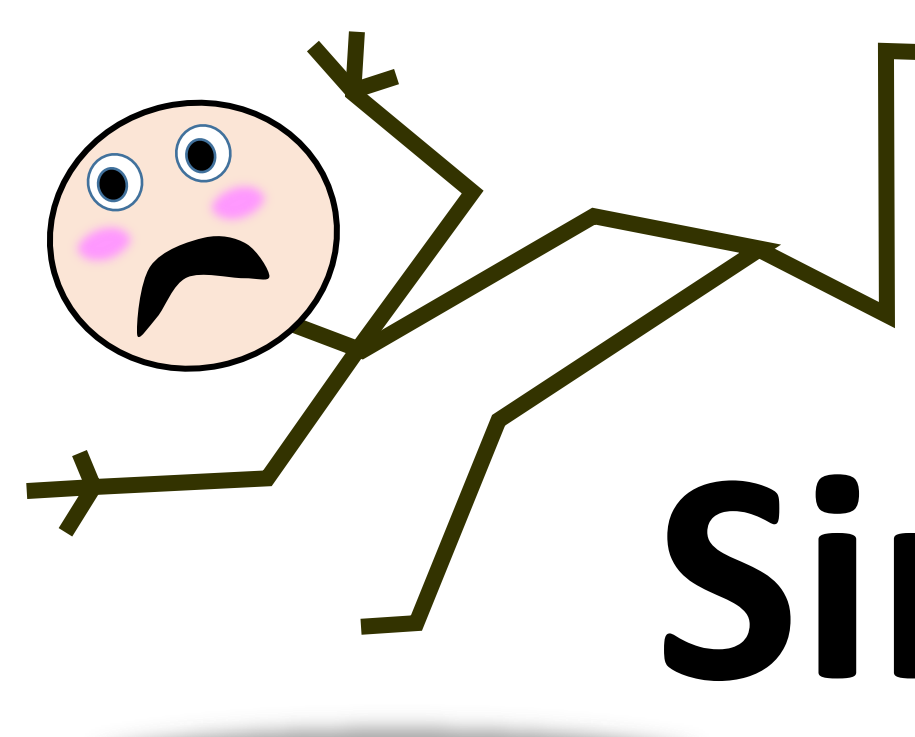

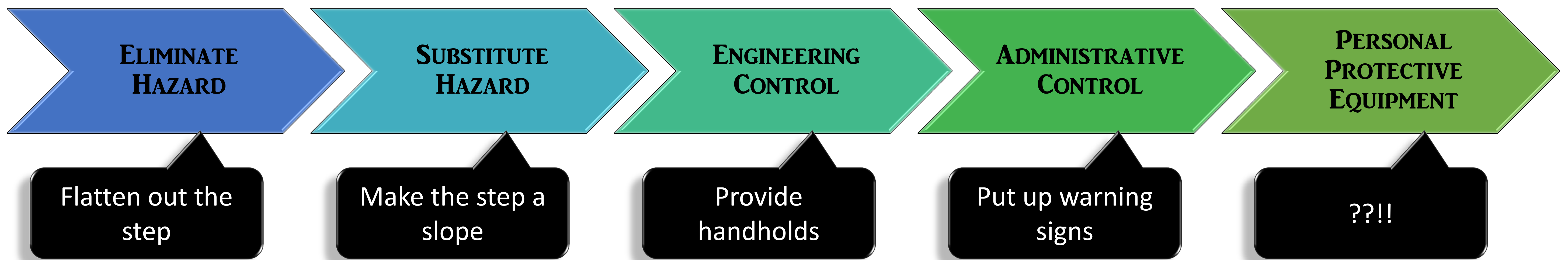
Managing Trip Hazards in Singapore General Hospital

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Trip hazards should always be designed out of any facility but when that is not possible, interventions must be made to eliminate them. In an acute healthcare facility like SGH, where there are thousands of pedestrians on any day of the week and anytime of the day, walkways have to cater to people of all shape and size. Follow the hierarchy of risk controls for the best solution!



SAFE BY DESIGN!

An emergency exit door should open to a safe path for escape, free of trip hazards and any other obstruction.



Emergency exit door can be used at any time. Steps should be lit at night, highlighted and evenly spaced. Open drains along the path of exit should be covered.
