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NTRODUCTION

Hand Hygiene is a general term that refers to the use of microbial or non-microbial solution to the hands to disinfect them.

Do you know

- At any point of time, there are at least 1.5 million cases of Hospital Acquired Infections (HAI) worldwide (WHO, 2016)
- Hand Hygiene has been recognized as a single most effective way to reduce infectious diseases.
- Alcohol based hand rub can reduce bacteria by 70% as compared to the antimicrobial soap which reduces only by 4%

OBJECTIVES

EDUCATE INITIATE SUSTAIN

- To EDUCATE staff on the importance of Hand Hygiene and right methodology to do it
- To INITIATE & instill the practice of performing hand hygiene as a part of their daily job
- To SUSTAIN the improvement achieved by implementing right strategies and methodical approaches

To convene the process of performing hand hygiene

By introducing hand rub at each food trolley







Continuous educating and training the staff:

 Regular training and demonstration for the staff to practice right methodology















IT intervention

- Use of 'SEMMEL' app (downloaded by the team of internal auditors on their phones) to audit staff's compliance rate
- Any non-compliance to be tracked with immediate corrective action

Displaying visual posters and reminders:

Placing visual posters at strategic locations such as food trolleys,
wards and patient room doors /cubicles





Synergistic relation with nursing and Infection control dept.

- Work with nursing department to borrow the extra pair of eyes to check on staff's compliance at ward level
- Work with Infection control department to garner necessary support to launch, devise regular audit formats and analyze results to improve compliance

RESULT

HAND HYGIENE 2015 - 2017:



The hand hygiene results were improved by almost 67% within the period of 2 years approximately

Staff appreciation

 Involve senior management to recognise staff's compliance and reward them likewise

CONCLUSION

An all-rounded end to end approach fortified with staff education on the importance of hand hygiene, provision of resources, implementing relevant processes, IT intervention to track compliance, working with other departments such as nursing and personal accountability led to the improvement of the hand hygiene results by almost 67% within the period of 2 years approximately
