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In response to Agency For Integrated Care's request (AIC) in November 2011 to bulk purchase 669 beds for 3 relocating nursing homes (NHs) by February 2013 to meet the opening date.


AIM

Streamline the procurement process for acquiring the beds for the nursing homes.

Explore value add initiatives to reduce administrative works for the nursing homes.

METHODOLOGY

RESULT

Prior to this, the NHs had no experience in large-scale equipment procurement.

- The term contract was extended to the 27 nursing homes under the Shared Procurement Programme by AIC.
- The contract included free preventive maintenance of beds for 2 years.
- An informative indent form with item description, picture and pricing was created for the purpose of evaluation and ordering.
- The project was completed within 10 months by September 2012 and met the first delivery target in February 2013 for the 3 relocating nursing homes.

CONCLUSION

- The term contract reduced the duplication of procurement process in the 27 participating nursing homes.
- The users had feedback that the pictorial indent form is easy to understand & reduced the response time needed for evaluation and ordering.
- The nursing homes were happy to have the preventive maintenance for their beds purchased as many of them do not have the internal resources to do routine maintenance.
- The contract was awarded to 2 vendors and broke the current reliance on the dominant vendor in the market which also provided more options for the nursing homes.
