

Creating a Professional Track for SingHealth **Cross Institution** Infection Control (CIIC) Auditors



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
SingHealth Duke-NUS Institute for Patient Safety & Quality (IPSQ)

1. Background

IPSQ adopts an integrating approach in managing patient safety and quality and encourages interdisciplinary collaborations and coordination among our stakeholders and partners. The Cross Institutional Infection Control (CIIC) Audit was set up to ensure high level of standards in infection prevention and control and as many as 154 inter-professional CIIC Auditors have been trained and appointed.

2. Aims

As part of the efforts to drive the professional development track for the CIIC auditors, IPSQ together with the CIIC Lead collaborate to improve the current audit system, training, and recognition of the auditors. In order to standardize and skillset/knowledge, we embarked on LEARN, UNLEARN and **RELEARN** journey together.



3. Methodology

Two (2) Auditor's workshops were organized to align the auditors' knowledge and skillset. The workshops was well received and feedback gathered was positive. Auditors are more confident to conduct the audit after the workshop.






The following timeline shows the key milestones the CIIC audit group has achieved thus far.
