Role Expansion for Enrolled Nurses, Assisting in Breast Surgical Procedures



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
Background

Breast surgery involves a surgical team made up of the surgeon and two of his team doctors to scrub up as assistants and a scrub nurse. Traditionally, the role of retracting the breast tissue is done by the assistants. During the COVID-19 pandemic, many surgical doctors were deployed out to work in areas such as the inpatient wards, Emergency Department as well as at the Dormitories for Foreign Workers. Hence, the surgical team was short-handed resulting in lack of assistant for the surgeons in breast surgical procedures. Without a capable assistant, the duration of the procedure may be prolonged and potentially, also cancellation or a longer waiting time for patients

Objectives

To develop a training program for the Enrolled Nurses to take on the enhanced role of assisting surgeons during breast surgeries in Major Operating Theatre within three months.

Interventions / Initiatives


Month	Initiative	Progress
Feb - March	 Identification of potential eligible staff as participants Discussion on relevant topics 	Identified ENs who verbalized their interests and showed high motivation to be part of project. Practical lessons on scrubbing, gowning and gloving, different types of instrumentation, safe sharps handling and techniques in assisting during surgery. Met up with the surgeon to discuss on basic requirements of ENs holding retractors during surgery.
March - April		Surgeon conducted lectures on different types of breast surgery and various retraction techniques. OT Clinical Instructors (CI) shared on surgical asepsis and responsibilities of a surgical assistant. Cls conducted practical sessions on scrubbing, gowning and gloving, different types of instrumentation, safe sharps handling and techniques in assisting during surgery. Created record on assisting during breast surgery to track performance. Developed competency checklist on ENs Assisting and Performing the Role of Retracting Breast Tissue during Surgery.
April - May	OJT with assigned preceptor	Briefed Preceptors to guide and monitor ENs' performance to gain support & understanding Conducted briefing in small groups.


Results
