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
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BACKGROUND

However, since 2013, there was a significant number of inappropriately disposed item received by SSU reported.

3. Aim

The aim of the project was to reduce the number of inappropriately disposed items received by SSU.


Immediate communication to the source departments and reporting into the online Risk Management System (RMS)

Monthly monitoring & communication to the management was performed




Trend Analysis

Number of Inappropriately Disposed Items Received by SSU (CY2013 – 2021)

The number of inappropriately disposed items received by SSU reduced by approximately 80% from 2013 to 2021
