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#### Background

#### What is an Evaluation Process?

The Evaluation process is part of a sourcing event to select the right product from the right supplier to meet the specifications & user needs by an appointed Committee.

### Review of the current process (for Nursing):

- No. of participating institutions: 12 to 15
- Nominations of Evaluation Committee (EC) members response time: Average 2 weeks.
  - Ward & OT contracts: 30 members
  - Ward OR OT contracts: 18 members
- No regular EC members
  - Briefing of EC Roles & Responsibilities, Conflict of Interest, Acronyms, Procurement Process for first-time EC member at each EC meeting: 15 minutes
- Difficulty in sourcing for meeting venue to cater for 30 to 35 pax
- The time taken for evaluation, depending on the complexity of the contract, is usually 4 to 8 hours



#### Aim

This project aims to streamline the evaluation process to increase efficiency, improve productivity and promote communities of practice

#### Methodology

#### **Step 1 Selection & Formation of dedicated EC**

- For Ward medical supplies contract 11 domain expert
- For OT supplies contract 10 domain expert
- Infection Control 10 members (when required by Ward or OT contracts)

# Step 2 Nominations by 11 PHIs Chief Nurses based on their expertise knowledge & experience & empowerment to make decisions

 Letter of Appointment with Terms of Reference on Roles & Responsibilities for a tenure of 3 years

## Step 3 Table Top Evaluation (TTE) - face-to-face meeting with physical samples to evaluate

- On-the-spot decision & consensus for acceptable products that meet the criteria
- identify alternatives for risk mitigation

Step 4 Sharing of the latest clinical practices, best practices & latest technology

- Reduce the number EC members per meeting by 37%
