Processing Pharmacy Bills in a Snap!

1 Introduction

On a yearly basis, the Employee Services team in Strategic HR (SHR) processes close to 3,500 staff pharmacy bills. The process is laborious, time consuming and error prone as it requires HR staff to manually enter each transaction into the Human Resource Information System (HRIS) in order to deduct employees' co-payment or excess utilisation of medical benefit from employee's salary.

With the aim to streamline processing and improve staff productivity, the Employee Services team explored the feasibility of mass uploading billing transactions from the corporate billing reports provided by service providers into the HRIS.

2 Methodology

From the fish bone diagram (Figure 2.1), the team has identified 3 key factors contributing to the slow processing time of pharmacy bills.

Time Consuming

High volume of transactional bills requires manual verification and entry of claims information into HRIS. Hence, substantial time and resources were required to process these claims.


Human Error

Hardcopy bill reflects numerous details. Thus, greater concentration and effort is required from the HR staff to analyse and process bills.


• Business Offices and HR office are scattered Internal dispatch takes approximately 2 days to deliver hardcopy bills. There is a higher risk of bills lost in transit. Hence, payment and deductions will be delayed.

3 Results

Instead of manually entering the bills into HRIS, the mass uploading function was adopted to enhance staff productivity and significantly reduce processing time for efficiency and accurate salary deduction.
