

Creating a platform to share and learn – SAS (Speciality & Ambulatory Services) Paediatric Nursing Symposium



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Introduction

Ambulatory nursing has been continuously projecting an incipient course in healthcare and is equally professionally challenging than acute care. Speciality & Ambulatory Services (SAS) is a targeted care distribution channel that must be organized and coordinated with the other elements of the continuum for continuity of

care of patients.



Aim

To address and introduce the wide range of ambulatory paediatric services available and provide clinical updates to all outpatient and inpatient nurses in delivering health care.

Methodology

An organising committee was set up with representation from all the paediatric outpatient clinics/centres. After a brainstorming session, a range of topics were chosen to be presented at the symposium.







An overwhelming response of 180 nurses attended the symposium of which 70% were inpatient nurses. 7% of the total number of participants that attended the symposium was from the women's clinics/wards. From the feedback received from the participants, 60% rated the symposium as excellent, informative and useful.





Conclusion

This symposium creates awareness amongst the inpatient nurses of the various ambulatory services available. It allows nurses to keep abreast of the various procedures done by nurses in the outpatient settings. There was a lot of opportunity to clarify, share, learn and collaborate towards a safe, comprehensive care of the patients.
