

Getting At Actual Usage at Point of Care is Key

- PROCEDURE card standardization starts with standard product identification
- Capturing usage at the point of care greatly enabled by standard barcodes with standard data
- Patient safety greatly improved by ensuring only "good" product is being used
- Patients assured of what products have been used on them
- Integrating supply chain information with clinical information allows tremendous insight into total value and quality of products used
- Charge capture integrity improves ensuring financial reimbursement



Sourcing Moves From Price to Outcomes-Impacted

- Strategic Sourcing starts with data transparency into actual product utilization
- Common data standards will provide clarity to what is used, from whom and how much allowing providers to intelligently analyze and predict future use.
- Product selection moves from lowest price to optimal product for the procedure based on outcomes
- Suppliers benefit by insight into customer usage and forecasts to better integrate/optimize supply chains up and down the chain

- Standards accelerate order processing speed across the supply chain
- Order processed to correct supplier entity
- Correct product at the correct time at the correct location
- Automatic replenishments drive assurance of contract compliance
- Automatic replenishments drive efficiencies and optimizes staffing requirements
- Payments to suppliers made more timely



Receiving "Drives" Right Product from Right Channel

- Standards efficiently ensure correct product received by utilizing GTIN and barcodes
- Accurate receiving speeds the payment process
- Shipping errors quickly identified BEFORE the product enters the supply chain
- Shipment/product tracking throughout the external and internal supply chain speeds up everything

- Payment processing becomes touch-less practically, minimizing resource requirements and potential errors
- Increased ability to take advantage of early payment discounts
- Possibility to eliminate the invoice altogether through Evaluated Receipts Settlement (ERS)
- Financial statements accuracy ensured as time from procure to pay is significantly reduced
- Suppliers get paid sooner

Barriers to Standardization – Suppliers



- Provider Recognition of Value
 - ✓ Not Hearing From Enough Providers
- Conflicting Priorities
 - ✓ Senior Leadership Understanding/Awareness
- Perceived Complexities
 - ✓ Internal Systems, Packaging Lines, etc
 - ✓ GTINs, GLNs, GDSN, etc etc etc
 - ✓ Global Manufacturers → Local Customers
- System Solution Providers Support
 - ✓ ERP, Point of Use, EHR
- Cost to Implement



Barriers to Standardization – Healthcare Providers



- Senior Leadership Understanding
 - ✓ Education on "What it is" and "Why Important"
 - ✓ Formal Adoption is Critical
- Pushback from Suppliers
 - ✓ Already Invested in Other Standards
 - ✓ Waiting to See What Global Standard Emerges
 - ✓ Not a Priority Not Understood
- Change Transition Can Be Complicated
 - ✓ Internal Systems, Readers/Scanners, etc
- Perceived Cost
 - ✓ Cost of Not Implementing?


